

- The **Career Cluster Finder** helps students identify their interests and discover career clusters that contain careers that might interest them.

## Course Selection Sheets

#### Due 11/30/22 to your advisor.

- Must pick 8 credits worth of classes. If we need to adjust things later, we can.
- Include remaining graduation requirements.
- Include credits for any approved CTE senior programs (refer to list/credits on back page)
- Pick electives based on identified career pathway and/or interest by referring to the chart in the Program of Studies.
- Year-long course requests, require another year-long or A/B semester course. (*see page 1 for options*)
- Interested in dual enrollment @ MVHS, sign up for credit. Eng 102 can be written in on pg 3 under " take a course not listed"
- Interested in dual enrollment at Carroll Community, indicate interest on page 3.
- Aide/Ind Study/Release Time/Internship: indicate interest on page 3 and pick 8 credits. Can drop one is application is approved.

- Available to 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders who meet the requirements.
- On-site courses @ MVHS vs. courses at Carroll Community College
- 3.0 unweighted GPA and 94% attendance for classes on college campus and math classes at MVHS.
- 2.5 unweighted GPA for English 101, 102, HIST 110 at MVHS.

Registration for Fall 2023 @ Carroll opens in April 2023. Students may register from April-August prior to classes beginning.



### **Advanced Placement Program**

AP courses are college-level courses, offered at MVHS.

AP courses offer an end-of course assessment in May each year. Qualifying scores are given college credit.

AP courses are rigorous and recommended for students who are college-bound after graduation.

- Sign up for 8 credits and when/if approved, we will adjust your course requests.
- Aide applications are available from the teacher or teacher's department chairperson. Once completed, turned in to school counselor to adjust schedule.
- If interested in an independent study or release time, make an appointment with your counselor.
- If interested in an internship, make an appointment with Ms. Brezicki.
